You all might have noticed by now that I like computers and gadgets. Last week, Apple Computer made a big announcement of new versions of the iPads and their desktop operating system!

As soon as a friend mentioned there was a new iPad announced, rather than asking my friend where I could find the details, I just clicked on Apple's website.

And – not more than an hour or two after the product announcement – the first thing I saw on their home page was a photo of the new iPad, with links to videos, more photos, all the technical specifications, and pricing.

What makes their company website so useful is that I can count on the fact that it will always have the most updated, accurate information, as well as photos, videos, and other ways to learn more. Now, I'm not suggesting we as Head of Christiana PC are in the same league as Apple, but as we enter the final stages of our new website development, there are some things we can learn from them!

Up-to-Date Information: Our new site is being built in WordPress, which is what's known as a Content Management System, or CMS. This software will make it extremely easy for us to add new events, photos, and other info as often as we want. In addition to the latest newsletter, each week we will add a transcript of the sermon, a copy of the bulletin, and periodic blog-style notes from your pastors.

Lots of (Useful) Information: Because we can easily keep the site updated, we will have a built-in archive of newsletters, sermons, and bulletins, as well as meeting calendars, the latest photos from church events, and more! This makes our website more than a marketing tool; it will also be a useful place to check in for a whole variety of reasons.

Not a One-Person Job: Let's face it; Apple has a whole team of people working to keep their website flashy and new. We don't have that kind of resources, but we do ...continued on next page have a whole community of people who already work to keep this church running! The CMS software allows us to give several different people access to update particular parts of the site. We will have at least one person from each commission with access to their specific area, and training on how to keep it up to date! With multiple people pitching in and taking responsibility for small pieces, we will easily keep up a welcoming and inviting public face for anyone who might be interested in visiting our church. Keep an eye out – our new site will launch later in November, and it's going to be beautiful!

THANKSGIVING FACTS

- Benjamin Franklin wanted the turkey to be the national bird of the United States.
- Sarah Josepha Hale, an American magazine editor, persuaded Abraham Lincoln to declare Thanksgiving a national holiday. She is also the author of the popular nursery rhyme "Mary Had a Little Lamb"
- Abraham Lincoln issued a 'Thanksgiving Proclamation' on third October 1863 and officially set aside the last Thursday of November as the national day for Thanksgiving.
- The annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade tradition began in the 1920's.
- In 1939, President Roosevelt proclaimed that Thanksgiving would take place on November 23rd, not November 30th, as a way to spur economic growth and extend the Christmas shopping season.
- Congress to passed a law on December 26, 1941, ensuring that all Americans would celebrate a unified Thanksgiving on the fourth Thursday of November every year.
- Since 1947, the National Turkey Federation has presented a live turkey and two dressed turkeys to the President. The President does not eat the live turkey. He "pardons" it and allows it to live out its days on a historical farm.

Local grocery stores have their lowest prices and coupon campaigns before Thanksgiving. We request that you pledge a turkey and/or canned goods now so you can take advantage of the upcoming holiday sales.
