Prepare the Way of the Lord ... 2013 Yes, there is a place for you, your family and friends at Head of Christiana. Younger and older, we will delight in the Advent season and Christmas. In the spirit of Head of Christiana and this hope-filled season, let us join in worship and fellowship.

Sunday, December 1st: Advent I we light the first candle of the Advent Wreath and celebrate with Holy Communion. Sunday afternoon at 4:00 we return to the

sanctuary for a Harp Concert in Candlelight, featuring the Brandywine Harp orchestra. Bring the family. Invite some friends.

Sunday, December 8th: Advent II features our choir with Kate LeFranc preaching.

Sunday, December 15th: Advent III features our choir and Bob Undercuffler preaching. A brief congregational meeting for the election of new officers and then delicious treats in Chapel Hall prepared by Care and Fellowship follows worship.

Sunday, December 22nd: Advent IV, amid flowers and sparkling Christmas tree decorated with hand-crafted Chrismons, we travel closer to Bethlehem with Kate preaching. The Joy Offering will be received.

At 2:30 we gather in Chapel Hall, warm-up our voices, set car pools, and go Christmas Caroling — for young and older – friends, family and

Christmas Eve: Follow luminaries to the sanctuary and worship in candlelight for a service of scripture and carols with meditation by Bob. Christoper Braddock, guitar, and Jean Marie Kolka Braddock, violin, will offer special music. The service will include the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

Sunday, December 30th: 11:00 a.m. Christmas worship with carols galore.

Remember, each Advent Sunday begins with Sunday School for all children, youth and adults at 9:30. Nursery and toddler care available for little ones. Pastors Bob and Kate will lead adults through the Feasting on the Word Advent Bible study.

Like Lent, Advent can be a great time to try out something new in your spiritual life, whether alone or with family and friends. At Head of Christiana, we will use the candles of our Advent Wreath to mark the coming of Christ's light into the world; one candle for each of the four weeks, then the Christ candle in the center to be lit on Christmas Eve. What other ways will you observe the season this year?

Here are some possible ideas – what else can you think of?

Personal Advent Wreath: This could be as fancy as you want, or as simple as five candles arranged in a circle. Set aside a moment each night to prayerfully light the candles.

Storybook-A-Day: Wrap up 25 Christmas, winter, or other holiday-themed books, and open one every evening to read as a family. **Advent Calendar:** Not just for kids! Buy a commercial calendar or make your own, with a sweet treat, bible verse, or reflection for each day.

Build a Nativity Scene: Starting with an empty stable or a spot on a shelf, add one or two figures every week until the star and the Christ child appear on Christmas. If you have kids, try hiding the figures throughout the house!

Bible Study: Join us for adult Bible Study on Thursdays from 11:30 - 1 or Sundays from 9:30 - 10:30. Or, read through one of the gospels on your own.

Personal Spiritual Practice: Take on something new this season, like daily prayer, journaling, drawing, a guided reflection, or something else that helps you to feel God's presence.


