But we need not dwell on the differences, nor be consumed by them, nor battle over them.

So here is a new opportunity. A faithful and courageous challenge for Lent, and beyond. We are indeed Christ's representatives. God uses us to persuade men and women to drop their differences and enter into God's work of making things right between them. Remember, **God is already a friend with you.**

PANCAKES TO ASHES CELEBRATION


From Pancakes to Ashes Our Lenten Journey Begins

Wednesday, March 5 our Head of Christiana family and friends will celebrate our second annual Pancakes to Ashes festivity. This unique liturgical tradition will begin with a Pancake Supper in Chapel Hall beginning at 6:00 p.m. We will all enjoy pancakes, tasty syrups, sausage, fruit and beverages.

At 7:00 the lights will dim and we will begin our journey into Lent. This 30 minut service will include hymns, scripture, and reflection and worshippers who so choose will be marked with ashes in the form of the cross.

Definitions:

Shrove Tuesday gets its name from the shriving (confession and absolution) the Christians were expected to receive immediately before Lent. The Pennsylvania



Ash Wednesday marks the first day of Lent. It occurs forty-six days before Easter, but Lent is nevertheless considered forty days long, because Sundays in this period are not counted as days of penance. (Sunday worship always celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ). For the Ash Wednesday service, worshippers may choose to be marked in the form of a cross with black ashes by one of the pastors. The ashes are prepared by burning palm leaves from the previous year's Palm Sunday celebration and mixing them with olive oil.

A Lenten Discipline – A Devotional practice. A booklet entitled "Cross-Bound" to assist in our Lenten journey is being provided by our Worship Commission for individuals and families.

This devotion begins on Ash Wednesday, and with each day we travel through the last week of Jesus' life as told in the Gospel of Luke. Each daily meditation includes a prayer and a scripture reading. We pray that this lent we will not simply read about the cross, but be bound for it and bound to it, that, like Jesus, we will learn to live "cross-bound" lives of love as we await resurrection dawn.


