

"NEWTON," OUR HoC FIG TREE

And now, "Newton" is yielding a good crop of figs. However, Hilary and Aileen were shocked to see Lantern Flies near the one they picked so we are going to have to be vigilant and destroy any eggs (and flies) we see.

The fig tree is not mentioned very often in the Bible, but there is a well-known story that features a fig tree. Jesus showed anger when he stopped under one in full bloom, hoping to ease his hunger, but finding the tree to be baren of fruit. He cursed the fig tree causing it to die.

When Aileen was mulling over doing a fun project for VBS that would produce a lasting interest in our church for the kids, she thought of planting a fig tree and watching it yield fruit and memories. She bought one in early Spring and nurtured it until VBS started so it would thrive and be ready for planting. They lucked out finding just the right spot to plant it—right at the corner next to the herb garden. So after their class session, they all went out and the kids had fun taking the shovel and digging the hole and watering it. They decided to call the fig tree "NEWTON."

When Lucy heard the discussion about planting a fig tree, she was reminded of a VBS program she attended in her youth and suggested the title for our upcoming VBS. We titled our VBS program that year, "Faith In God," (FIG).

Aileen has always thought this about the fig tree after it was planted: "May it give food to the traveler and shade for the weary to rest"






GIVING OPPORTUNITIES
