Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup> was another successful service by Head of Christiana at Hope Dining Room. Rosi White, Kay Wood, Kay Brook, Holly Williams and myself volunteered to serve. We fed 17 clients, served up six second-helpings and fed six workers.

We served pulled pork sandwiches which were a super hit with our clients. Of course, the green bean casserole got rave reviews. One client lives in Wilmington and took two buses to come eat with us because he loves our green beans. A "sleeper hit" was vine ripe tomato sandwiches. One of the women told us that we offered many delicious foods that she could never make for her family at home.

We had a chance to talk to a woman who told us two months ago she was home-less. This month she came in and is doing much better. She has a place to live and feels better about herself and her situation.

We also had a man named James who told us he has been fighting stage 4 cancer for about a year and half. He came for the food and really just wanted to talk to us. We made him feel loved and cared for.

In addition to the food, HoC offered 15 ladies' blouses, 3 pairs of winter gloves, a winter coat, bibles, and children's bible story books.

If you are someone who is not normally involved in our church's ministry at HOPE, there is a way you can help even if you can't serve lunches. Our ministry here at Head of Christiana tries to offer clothing, books, shoes, and household items to the clients at HOPE. Last month we had four clients tell us they had been called to come down because there were donated items that they knew these folks needed. What a blessing our church is in our community!

#### Update on Congregational Renewal Grant (Lilly Grant) Application

Dear HoC members and friends,


As you recall, HoC submitted an application for a Congregational Renewal Grant through the Lilly Foundation to cover costs associated with my sabbatical in 2023. Unfortunately, we were informed that we were not selected to be grant recipients. As I stated at the time we applied, these grants are very competitive, and we were not guaranteed to receive this funding. I'm glad we applied for the grant, as the application process providing direction in planning the sabbatical. This process gave us the opportunity to include a lot of congregational input and feedback. Sometimes we take risks that don't work out the way we hoped, but the process helps us learn and grow.

So what does this mean for the sabbatical plans? Well, the sabbatical will still take place next spring/early summer (2023), but will be a simplified version with a lower overall cost. For my sabbatical activities, I have some alternative funding sources from which I can draw. Per the presbytery sabbatical policy, I will be utilizing professional expense/continuing education funds budgeted as part of my terms of call from 2022 and 2023 (unused funds from this year will be rolled over into next year). I will also apply for additional funding through the denomination's Board of Pensions, as well as look into other possible grant sources. Expenses related to pastoral coverage during the sabbatical will be part of our general 2023 budget, which is funded through congregational giving and our endowment. As we move forward with sabbatical planning, we will keep you all informed along the way. Please feel free to reach out to me with any questions.

Thank you all for being part of the planning and application process! I really appreciate everyone's input, questions, feedback, and encouragement. I particularly want to thank the group that worked on the actual application with me – Kay Brook, Steve Graham, Katie Gillespie, and Betsy VanCulin. It was a lengthy process with many components, and I appreciate this group's time and dedication in working with me to complete the application and submit it on time. Thank you for supporting me in taking this planned sabbatical. I'm very blessed to be able to take this time of refreshment and renewal. I look forward to seeing how God will work in our lives and our church through this period.
