As I return to the regular rhythms of work and worship post-sabbatical, I am sensing it is a good time for us as a church to practice the **three Rs – Reset, Recharge, and Renew**.

First, the beginning of a new season provides an opportunity to **reset** some of our practices and routines. Over the next few weeks, the sabbatical bulletin boards will be coming down and replaced with new content, photos and information from the pastor. In addition to notices of upcoming events and activities, I'll be posting a refresher about my contact information, office hours, day off, social media engagement, and other pertinent information. I'll also occasionally share resources that I'm finding interesting and beneficial that you might enjoy. So, keep checking the boards for fresh content! We'll also be reintroducing monthly liturgists to participate in worship, as well as continue our monthly congregational flowers in the sanctuary. 

Thank you all so much for your service to God today (August 11), at Hope. Brookside, Todd Estates, and Sherwood Park are three communities that are close to Hope Dining Room that were heavily impacted by the storm last Monday. Many homes in this area were without electricity for two days. Several of the clients at Hope talked to us about damage, no power for cooking and no air conditioning. People were coming to Hope for food, fellowship, and air conditioning. We served 48 people with firsts. We ran out of coleslaw, baked beans, and watermelon. We even had one regular who came in after we had closed and cleaned up. We were able to give him a 3-cup container of Beef Stew as a meal-to-go.

Please keep James in your prayers. He is starting to talk about the limited time he has left as the cancer treatments are wearing him down.

Ryan was rushing to get to us before we closed. He seemed worried where his next meal was coming from. Shaun loved the pulled pork and was grateful for fresh fruit and vegetables he could chew in spite dental issues. One grandmother with her four grandkids was happy to be able to feed her family and thankful that the kids were welcomed and safe.

Pastor Hilary will also be launching a "gratitude challenge" in October – Each day, congregation members and friends will be challenged to practice gratitude in their everyday lives through simple, hands-on, fun activities. This is the perfect challenge to give you an attitude of gratitude!


We hope all of these offerings will inspire everyone to rediscover the joy of stewardship, not just during the campaign, but all through the year.


