Advent Hope—Powerful Prayer!

In December, we will be observing Advent, a season of four weeks when we prepare our hearts for the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ at Christmas. The word "Advent" means "coming" – it is a season of preparing for the coming of Christ to earth. During this season, we read verses from the prophets who foretold of the Christ's coming in ancient times. We light candles, one for each week of the Advent season. As the days grow darker and colder, Advent symbolically reminds us that God is shining his light into our troubled and fallen world. All that is shrouded in the darkness of sin, suffering, violence, fear and death will soon be flooded with the light of Christ's love and redemption.

Advent prepares us once again for Christ's first coming to earth as a humble baby born in a manger. Yet, Advent also points forward to Christ's second coming, when he will come in judgment and triumph. Advent reminds us that we are living in this painful period between Christ's first and second coming – the "already" and the "not yet." We affirm that Christ is already present with us, yet the world is still clearly not as it ought to be. We hear stories on the evening news about wars, mass shootings, terrorist attacks, devastating natural disasters, and many other terrible things. We see that our society is still bitterly divided over cultural and political issues. Advent is a season that gives us hope that God is working to put the world right – bringing God's kingdom down to earth.

Advent reminds us that God did not leave us alone in our troubled world, but sent his only Son, Jesus the Christ to redeem and heal us. Advent gives us hope as we wait for the Lord's full redemption at the end of the age. Advent also gives us the courage to act on this hope, working for goodness and justice in our world here and now, until God's reign is fully realized. The call of the church is to live into this Advent hope, working with God in the Spirit's power to bring about his kingdom purposes for love, justice, and mercy in our community.

This Advent season, I'm challenging our church to pray a prayer for power – specifically God's power to renew our church and renew our lives so that God's love can shine forth into our hurting world. Details on this prayer challenge and how to participate are in this newsletter. I will also be sharing details from the pulpit during this Advent season. Please join me in praying for God's transforming power to be active in our lives, in our church, and in our community.

"I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may perceive what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come." – *Ephesians 1:16-2*

ADVENT PRAYER CHALLENGE

During the Advent season, we are called to "watch and pray" for Jesus' presence as we await his return in glory. God wants us to experience Jesus' power here and now, in our lives and in the life of our church.

Beginning December 1st, pray for our church using the "Power Prayer" adapted from Ephesians 1:15-19 (The Message Version):

Dear Lord, thank you for the solid trust you have given us in the Master Jesus and your outpouring of love to all of us as we seek to follow Jesus. I give thanks continually for this church and all who gather here for worship. God of our Master, Jesus Christ, God of glory, make us intelligent and discerning in knowing Christ personally, our eyes focused and clear, so that we can see exactly what it is Christ is calling us to do in our church and in our community. Let us grasp the immensity of this glorious way of life he has for us as his followers - the utter extravagance of his work in us who trust him—endless energy, boundless strength! We pray this in Christ's powerful name, Amen.

Pray this prayer each day until Christmas Day – December 25th (you can keep praying it after Christmas as well!)







Christmas Worship at HoC

Since Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year, the session has decided to adjust the liturgical calendar in November and December to better accommodate the needs of our congregation during the holiday season. We are moving up the liturgical calendar one week beginning in mid-November. This will give us the opportunity to observe the four weeks of Advent and Christmas Eve, each on their own Sundays.

Liturgical schedule for November/December worship:

Sunday, November 19th – Christ the King Sunday

Sunday, November 26th - First Sunday in Advent

Sunday, December 3rd – Second Sunday in Advent

Sunday, December 10th – Third Sunday in Advent

Sunday, December 17th - Fourth Sunday in Advent

Sunday, December 24th – Christmas Eve (Evening candlelight service only – No morning service)

Sunday, December 31st – (Virtual worship only)
Café gathering in Fellowship Hall (watch the virtual service together on the big TV)

PLEASE NOTE: There will be NO MORNING SERVICE on Christmas Eve, Sunday, December 24th. We will have our traditional Christmas Eve candlelight service of lessons and carols in the evening at 7:30 PM in the sanctuary.

On Sunday, December 31st, there will be VIRTUAL WORSHIP ONLY, with a café church gathering in the Fellowship Hall for those who wish to watch the virtual service together on the big TV.

Later that evening as they were bundled up in their bed covered in warm blankets, she felt teardrops running down her cheeks. Her thankful heart was overcome by the generosity of strangers who provided this room, this bed, and the luxury of a hot bath. In this moment, she knew that God had provided for them and would during their time of homelessness. They needed to pray and trust that Mathew would find a job. Tomorrow was another day. The two boys, Adam and Lucas, would attend school and there they would receive their lunch. She would check out the soup kitchen and visit a few churches in town.

Snow had fallen through the night, and the world looked changed. The boys were really excited to see the trees dressed in white as they walked to school from the motel. Their footprints made an imprint in the snow—joy was found in something so simple! They were lucky they had nice warm coats, since they did know a few children who were not as lucky as them. Mathew watched as the boys entered school and then he headed toward the Home Depot to see if they needed extra help. He had worked at J. C. Penney's in the summer while he was attending the university. Mathew wondered how come everything in his life changed and why they lost everything. One bad investment and a crooked scheme is what brought them here. Lizabeth, his wife, had held them together with her deep belief in God and in him.

At Home Depot, as he approached the counter to apply, a stranger in a business suit watched him. Walking right towards him, he offered him a job in his warehouse. How did he know that

I needed a job? Was this an angel of God bringing them together? Yes, he accepted, and left with this angel to see where he would be working.

While Mathew had walked the boys to school before going to Home Depot to apply for a job, Lizabeth had visited the church nearby. There she explained their situation to the priest, who called a friend who would be glad to offer employment to Mathew. That is how Frank Bloom found Mathew at Home Depot. God was nearby.

Lizabeth and Mathew were overjoyed that night as they informed their two sons that soon they would be in their own rooms again and off the streets.

A few days before Christmas, they found the perfect apartment. When the congregation of the church learned their dilemma, they came and helped furnish the apartment with love. Then, on Christmas day, a tiny little girl with rosy cheeks blessed the family. The boys were delighted to have a little sister as their Christmas gift!
