The Session and COMC have now established a new pastoral relationship with me. As of October 1, I have been selected/called to be your 'Bridge' Pastor. In a time of transition, the church has created the concept of a 'Bridge' Pastor and in the case of HOC, the purpose is to provide a consistent pastoral presence just after the end of a permanent pastor and the start of a Transitional or Interim pastor. Dr. Hilary Livingston served this church for eight years before discerning a new call. A 'Bridge' Pastor means that the Session will not have to try to 'fill the pulpit' with a variety of pastors.

After retiring from the PCUSA in April, I am honored to be asked to serve as that consistent pastoral presence. My contract will be through the end of this year. The Session will then discern if they wish to pursue me as the Interim or look for someone else. We are so grateful for the hospitality we have received each time we have visited on Sunday mornings.

Our daughter and her family live in Port Deposit. They have three precious young boys and we are grateful to be part of their lives, living only 4 miles away from them in Rising Sun.

May God's grace surround all of us as we enter this relationship as a Community of Faith. I will be honored to serve as your pastor walking alongside this wonderful congregation. May God's kingdom grow as we all seek to faithfully follow Jesus Christ at HOC!

Introducing the Rev. Dr. Jim C. and Leslie Dunkin

Beginning October 1, Pastor Jim began serving as our Bridge Pastor by invitation of the HoC Session and the New Castle Presbytery. Jim obtained his M. Div. – Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary and his D. Min. – Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. After serving PCUSA churches in Oklahoma, Kansas, North Carolina and Virginia, Jim officially retired after 40 years of service to the church.

One of the greatest congregations Jim served was the First Presbyterian Church of Lawrence. Jim met the greatest gift from God in his life, Leslie, while he and Leslie attended the University of Kansas. Serving the church in Lawrence 20 years later enabled Jim and Leslie to celebrate the journey God had called Jim and Leslie to travel together. Thank you to everyone who made our service to God through Hope happen today; Rosi, Kay, Ruth, and Jeanne. We fed a large crew, between 35 and 40, depending on who you talk to. No one left hungry. We served pulled pork sliders, green bean casserole (Thanks Hilary), pasta salad, pickles, bean soup with crackers, fresh pears, popsicles and trail mix, along with Blue Hi-C, milk, and fruit juice.

Thanks to Sonia and Barbara, we offered warm blankets, shoes, glasses, shirts, and dishes. Plus, we provided a table with new books to read, Christian crafts for kids, and a few school supplies.

Kingswood Methodist Church also offers a food pantry that allows the Hope clients to have two bags of groceries per month. Apparently, the need has outpaced the food supplied, and the pantry had to close this week. Making sure the clients are well fed on Fridays is the best we can do to carry them over until Monday.
